Happy New Year! Christ the King Sunday and the 1st Sunday of Advent (November 24th and December 1st this year) mark the divide between church years. We have now entered Church Year C, which focuses on the Gospel of Luke.


Church Year C starts the same way Church Year B finishes, with apocalyptic, or end times, texts. We had Revelation 21:1-6 (November 3rd), Daniel 12:1-13 and Mark 13:1-8 (November 17th), Daniel 7:9-14 and Revelation 1:4-8 (November 24th) at the end of B, and Luke 21:25-36 (December 1st) to begin year C. Go ahead and look them up. Don't be afraid to crack that Bible open. Reading it will change your life! Setting it on your coffee table, not so much.

These cryptic tales of the "end of time" have led to immense speculation over the years: When will Christ return? What will that return look like? How will we know when that will take place?

But all that contemplation has led to tall tales, supposedly based on scripture, especially the book of Revelation. Most

of those "meditations on scripture" absolutely distort the message found there. Revelation, like all apocalyptic literature, is a call to remain faithful, even in the face of the trials and tribulations that life throws our way. The famous Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse from the opening of the seven seals in Revelation 6 are one example. The first, the rider of the white horse, represents the conquest of pestilence or disease. The second, the rider of the red horse, represents war. The third, the rider of the black horse, represents famine. The fourth, the rider of the pale green horse, represents death. Most interpretations

today take them as precursors, clear signs of Christ's imminent return. If you believe this to be true, the question I have for you is: have we ever had a time without disease, war, famine or death? No! So why

hasn't Christ already returned? I believe it's because we've been given a commission and we haven't yet finished our job. Jesus will return when everyone has at least had a chance to come to faith. That will require us to share our faith with everyone God puts in our lives.

Instead those who write book after book and movie after movie about the end times continue to pound the drums of war, even though these texts have never been a call to armed conflict. They've never been a demand that we destroy our fellow humans or that we tear down a rebuilt temple in Jerusalem before Christ will return. They don't require the destruction of nation after nation in order to prove our faithfulness. We do that by trusting the living Word of God when he says even he doesn't know the hour or the day of his return, and that it doesn't matter because our role hasn't changed. God wants all to be saved and we are supposed to be facilitating people coming to faith in a God who loves them, not scaring them with fabrications of combat, confrontation, struggle and strife.

How can I say that? Because of this passage that immediately precedes the defeat of the Beast and its armies: John's prophecy of the conquering Lamb from *Revelation 19:11-16*The Rider on the White Horse.

11 Then I saw heaven opened, and there was a white horse! Its rider is called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he judges and makes war. 12 His eyes are like a flame of fire, and on his head are many diadems; and he has a name inscribed that no one knows but himself. 13 He is clothed in a robe dipped in blood, and his name is called The Word of God. 14 And the armies of heaven, wearing fine linen, white and pure, were following him on white horses. 15 From his mouth comes a sharp sword with which to strike down the nations, and he will rule them with a rod of iron; he will tread the wine press of the fury of the wrath of God the Almighty. 16 On his













robe and on his thigh he has a name inscribed, "King of kings and Lord of lords."

Although he has an inscribed name that only he knows, the rider of the white horse is obviously Jesus, wearing the name "The Word of God." His not so secret title is revealed in :16; "King of kings and Lord of lords," which is inscribed on his thigh, where a sword would normally hang. This Lord and King wields a different kind of power. Before he even enters the fray, his robe is already bloody from his past victory, when he conquered death through his faithful suffering and sacrifice for us. He leads the armies of heaven, also riding white horses, but instead of battle dress, they were linen robes, washed white in the blood of the Lamb. Called and chosen by Christ, they are dressed in uniforms they earned by conquering evil through being faithful and by resisting idolatry and greed.

In the great cataclysmic battle of Revelation 19, what do the heavenly armies do? Nothing! Like the gift of our salvation, all the action belongs to Jesus Christ. "In righteousness **he** judges...from **his** mouth comes a sharp sword...**he** will rule them...**he** will tread the winepress of the fury of the wrath of God."

John's Revelation doesn't show the Christian community taking up arms against the nations of the world. Jesus is the agent of God's victory and the only weapon mentioned, or needed, is the Word of God. That is the weapon we are also called to brandish. But you need to know it in order to be able to utilize it.

So this New Year try again to read the Bible in a year, although if it takes you three years, you will still be ahead of 99% of the population. This New Year pledge to make it to church every Sunday possible and I will pledge to keep preaching on the Word of God. Every sermon I've given has been biblically based. Unless you're a seminary professor, I guarantee you'll learn something new each week. Even if you are a seminary professor, you might be surprised to learn new things, because I focus on the whole Bible, while they specialize. I believe the Psalms have much to teach us and you can't understand the New Testament until you understand the Old Testament, because the New Covenant is just a continuation of the Old Covenant (Testament comes from the Latin for Covenant).

And finally if you would like to start a Bible study, I would be delighted to facilitate in any way I can. If I'm leading a study, however, the problem for me is people look to me for the answers and discussion becomes a one-way street. If I'm only listening to myself talk, I never learn anything new. We all have different perspectives and experiences that can inform our interpretation of the text. I may need to hear what you have to say in order to better understand what God is trying to communicate to me, and vice versa. Hopefully we can inform each other. Happy New Year!






